FABRIC REQUIREMENTS & CUTTING GUIDE

- Fabric A- Large Brown Floral** 4812-0144 2 yards
- Cut one 8 ½" square.
 - Cut one 4 ½" x 42" strip. Sub-cut into eight 4 ½" squares.
 - Cut nine 5 ½" x 42" strips. Piece the strips together to make two 5 ½" x 86 ½" strips and two 5 ½" x 76 ½" strips.
- Fabric B- Tan Mini Flowers** 0218-0113 1/2 yard
- Cut three 4 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into twenty-four 4 ½" squares.
- Fabric C- Small Gray Flowers** 0216-0150 1-1/8 yards
- Cut one 8 -7/8" x 42" strip. Sub-cut into two 8-7/8" squares. Cut each square across one diagonal to make four large triangles.
 - Cut one 8 ½" x 42" strip. Sub-cut into four 8 ½" squares.
 - Cut three 4 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into twenty 4 ½" squares.
- Fabric D- Brown Vines** 0214-0144 1-1/8 yards
- Cut one 4 -7/8" x 42" strip. Sub-cut into four 4-7/8" squares. Cut each square across one diagonal to make eight medium triangles.
 - Cut one 4 ½" x 42" strip. Sub-cut into eight 4 ½" squares.
 - Cut four 2-3/8" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into fifty-six 2-3/8" squares. Cut each square across one diagonal to make (112) small triangles.
 - Cut six 2" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 2" squares.
- Fabric E- Blue & Brown Flowers** 0209-0150 1 yard
- Cut three 4 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into eight 4 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
 - Cut six 2" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 2" squares.
- Fabric F- Navy Dots** 0217-0150 2 yards
- Cut four 4 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into eight 4 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
 - Cut four 2-3/8" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into fifty-six 2-3/8" squares. Cut each square across one diagonal to make (112) small triangles.
 - Cut six 2" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 2" squares.
 - Cut nine 2 ½" x 42" strips for the binding.
- Fabric G- Main Stripe** 0205-0144 1-1/2 yards
- Fussy cut four strips ¼" on either side of the stripe to measure approx. 5" x 52".
- Fabric H- Cream & Tan Fans** 0211-0113 1-1/3 yards
- Cut six 3" x 42" strips. Piece the strips together to make two 3" x 49 ½" strips and two 3" x 54 ½" strips.
 - Cut eight 2 ½" x 42" strips. Piece the strips together to make two 2 ½" x 72 ½" strips and two 2 ½" x 76 ½" strips.
- Fabric I- Brown Dots and Stripe** 0210-0150 3/8 yard
- Cut two 3 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into fourteen 3 ½" squares.
- Fabric J- Green Fans** 0215-0114 3/8 yard
- Cut two 3 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into fourteen 3 ½" squares.
- Fabric K- Cream Mini Flowers** 0218-0190 1-3/4 yards
- Cut seven 2-3/8" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 2-3/8" squares.
 - Cut ten 3 ½" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric L- Tan Dots**0217-0114****1 yard**

- Cut six 3-7/8" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into fifty-six 3-7/8" squares. Cut each square across one diagonal to make (112) triangles.

Fabric M- Green Stripe**0213-0114****1/2 yard**

- Cut six 2" x 42" strips. Sub-cut into (112) 2" squares.

Backing- Blue & Brown Flowers**0209-0150****8 yards**

- Cut three 94" x 42" strips. Sew together and trim to make one 94" x 94" backing.

Block Assembly (See diagrams on Page 4)

1) Sew one medium Fabric D triangle to two adjacent sides of one 4 1/2" Fabric B square (Fig. 1). Sew one Fabric C large triangle to the Fabric B/D unit to make one Block One Corner Unit (Fig. 2). Repeat to make four Block One Corner Units.

2) Sew one small Fabric D triangle to two adjacent sides of one 2 3/8" Fabric K square (Fig. 3). Sew one Fabric L triangle to the Fabric K/L unit to make one Block Two Corner Unit (Fig. 4). Repeat to make fifty-six Block Two Corner Units.

3) Sew one small Fabric F triangle to two adjacent sides of one 2 3/8" Fabric K square (Fig. 5). Sew one Fabric L triangle to the Fabric F/K unit to make one Block Three Corner Unit (Fig. 6). Repeat to make fifty-six Block Three Corner Units.

4) Place one 4 1/2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of one 8 1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" from the sewn seam.

5) Follow Figure 9 for the seam direction to add one 4 1/2" Fabric D square and two 4 1/2" Fabric A squares to each of the remaining corners of the Fabric C square to make one Block One Side Unit (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a total of four Block One Side Units.

6) Repeat Steps 4-5 using two 2" Fabric D squares, two 2" Fabric E squares and one 3 1/2" Fabric K square to make one Block Two Side Unit (Fig. 11). Repeat to make fifty-six Block Five Side Units.

7) Repeat Steps 4-5 using two 2" Fabric F squares, two 2" Fabric M squares and one 3 1/2" Fabric K square to make one Block Three Side Unit (Fig. 12). Repeat to make fifty-six Block Three Side Units.

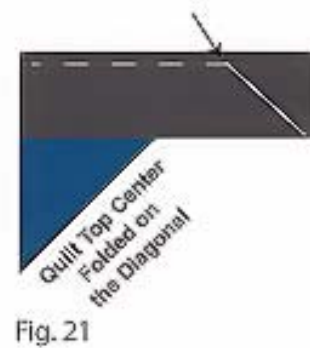
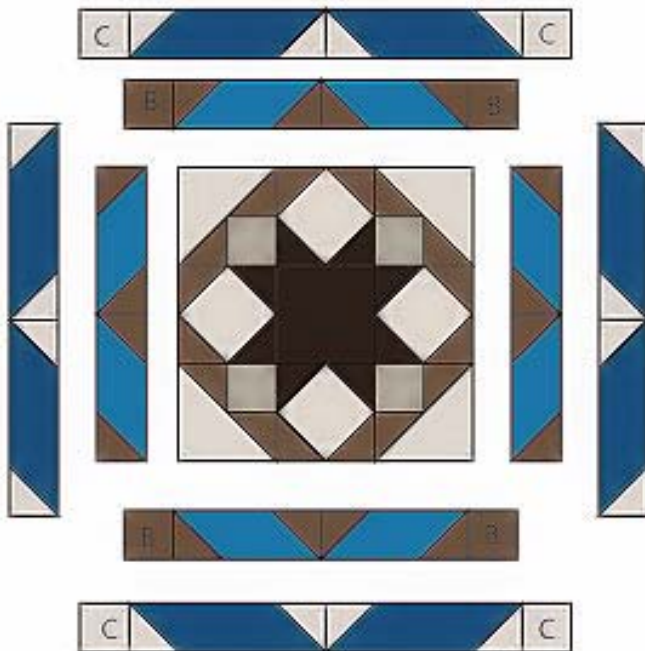
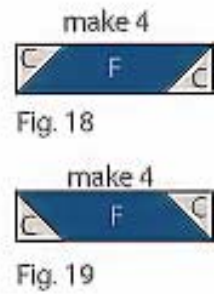
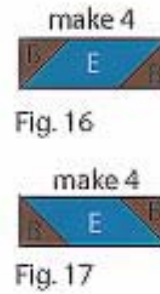
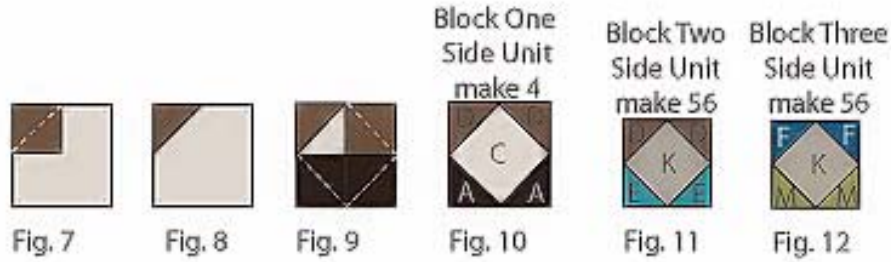
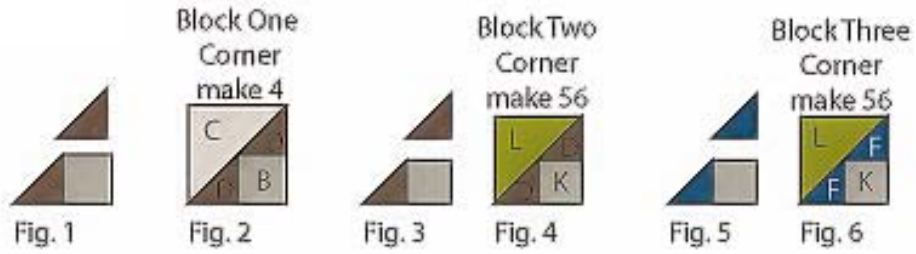
8) Following Figure 13, sew four Block One Corner Units, four Block One Side Units and one 8 1/2" Fabric A square together to make the 24 1/2" Center Block Square.

9) Following Figure 14, sew four Block Two Corner Units, four Block Two Side Units and one 3 1/2" Fabric I square to make one 9 1/2" Block Two Square. Repeat to make a total fourteen Block Two Squares.

10) Following Figure 15, sew four Block Three Corner Units, four Block Three Side Units and one 3 1/2" Fabric J square to make one 9 1/2" Block Three Square. Repeat to make a total of fourteen Block Three Squares.

11) Place one 4 1/2" Fabric B square on the left side of one 4 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Repeat with a 4 1/2" Fabric B square on the right side of the Fabric E strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make four left side B/E strips.

12) Place one 4 1/2" Fabric B square on the left side of one 4 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Repeat with a 4 1/2" Fabric B square on the right side of the Fabric E strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make four right side B/E strips.



13) Repeat Step 11 with eight 4 ½" Fabric C squares and four 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric F strips to make four left side C/F strips.

14) Repeat Step 12 with eight 4 ½" Fabric C squares and four 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric F strips to make four right side C/F strips.

Follow Figure 20 for the following steps

15) Sew together one left side B/E strip and one right side B/E strip to make one 4 ½" x 24 ½" B/E border. Repeat to make four B/E borders.

16) Sew one B/E border to each side of the 24 ½" Center Block. Sew one 4 ½" Fabric B square to each end of the remaining two B/E borders. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the center block to make the quilt top.

17) Sew together one left side C/F strip and one right side C/F strip to make one 4 ½" x 32 ½" C/F border. Repeat to make four C/F borders.

18) Sew one C/F border to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 4 ½" Fabric C square to each end of the remaining two C/F borders. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

Quilt Assembly (refer to the quilt layout while assembling the quilt top)

19) Center one 5" x 52" Fabric G strip on one side of the quilt top. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.

20) Repeat Step 19 to sew one 5" x 52" Fabric G strip to the top and one 5" x 52" Fabric G strip to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the quilt top.

21) To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 21). Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Fig. 21), draw a 45° line out to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric, leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

22) Sew one 3" x 49 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 3" x 54 ½" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Trim the quilt top to measure 54 ½" square.

23) Sew three Block Two squares and three Block Three squares together, alternating them to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.

24) Sew four Block Two squares and four Block Three squares together, alternating them to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.

25) Sew one 2 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2 ½" x 76 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

26) Sew one 5 ½" x 76 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the quilt. Sew one 5 ½" x 86 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

27) Layer and quilt as desired.

26) Sew the nine 2 ½" x 42" Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45° seams to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half, lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press.

27) Bind as desired.
