

Decorative Circle Garland

Designer Miriam Rawson created this festive garland trim especially for our booth at QuiltCon in February 2013 as a creative way to show off our CENTENNIAL SOLIDS collection, and the garland earned rave reviews, so we wanted to share the idea with you. Try it with a rainbow of colors like she did, or choose specific ones to identify a particular group, to suit a room décor, or just choose your favorites!

Make Our Circle Garland:

1. Apply paper-backed fusible web to various CENTENNIAL SOLIDS colors by Marcus.
2. Cut circles approx 3 to 4" in diameter from each of the fabrics. Pair circles as desired (either matching the colors, or contrasting them) and fuse them together.
3. Stitch through the center of the first circle pair, butting the second pair to the edge and continuing stitching down the center. Repeat until the desired length is achieved. Use a neutral thread color like tan or grey.

For added interest, pair solids with coordinating Marcus prints on the reverse.
