Quilting Skill: Beginner • Finished Quilt Size: 77" x 84" • Block count and size: 6" x 10"

Note: In cutting "wof" means width of fabric

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A	7935-0144	gray damask	1/2 yard
Fabric B	7938-0113	diagonal stripe	1 yard
Fabric C	7942-0140	tan texture	1-1/4 yards
Fabric D	8400-0140	tan/black geometric	1/2 yard
Fabric E	8395-0112	paisley	1-1/2 yards
Fabric F	8396-0143	large stripe	2 yards
Fabric G	8397-0113	brown medallions	1-1/8 yards
Fabric H	8398-0112	black mini-flowers	1 yard
Backing	8399-0144	gray leaves	5 yards

Cutting Guide:

Fabric A	Cut (2) 2-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (8) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces Cut (2) 4-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (16) 4-1/2" squares
Fabric B	Cut (8) 3-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end matching diagonal stripe pattern, recut into (2) side borders 3-1/2" x 70" and (2) top/bottom borders 3-1/2" x 63"
Fabric C	Cut (14) 1-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end, then recut into (4) side borders 1-1/2" x 70" and (4) top/bottom borders 1-1/2" x 63" Cut (1) 2-1/2" x wof strip, recut into (6) 2-1/2" squares and (2) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces Cut (5) 2-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (30) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces
Fabric D	Cut (9) 1-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end then recut into (6) 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" side borders and (2) 1-1/2" x 43-1/2" top/bottom borders
Fabric E	Cut (2) 5-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips on the length of the fabric Cut (1) 11-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips on the length of the fabric Cut (1) 8-1/2" strip on the length of the fabric, recut into (4) 8-1/2" squares
Fabric F	Cut (8) 8-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end matching stripes then recut into (2) side borders 8-1/2" x 68-1/2" and (2) top/bottom borders 8-1/2" x 61-1/2"
Fabric G	Cut (8) 4-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end matching diagonal stripe pattern, then recut into (2) side borders 4-1/2" x 70" and (2) top/bottom borders 4-1/2" x 63"
Fabric H	Cut (6) 1-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end then recut into (4) 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips and (4) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces Cut (1) 2-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (12) 2-1/2" squares Cut (8) 2-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end for binding
Backing	Cut yardage into 2 equal pieces and sew together selvedge to selvedge for backing.

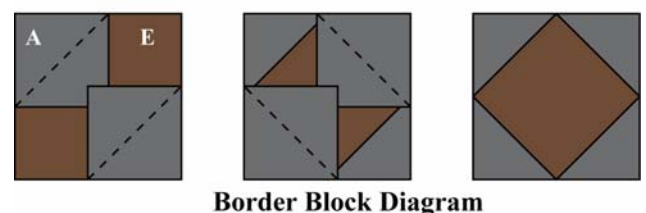
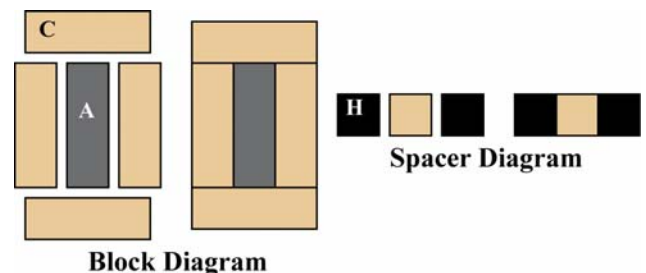
Instructions:

Blocks: Referring to the block diagram, sew a fabric C 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" piece to each side of a fabric A 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" piece. Press seams towards fabric A. Sew a fabric C 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" piece to the top and bottom of the C/A/C unit to complete the block. Make 8 blocks.

Spacers: Sew a fabric H 2-1/2" square to each side of a fabric C 2-1/2" square. Make 6 spacers.

Alternating 4 blocks with 3 spacers sew the blocks and spacers into a vertical row. Sew a fabric H 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" piece to the top and bottom of the row. Make 2 rows.

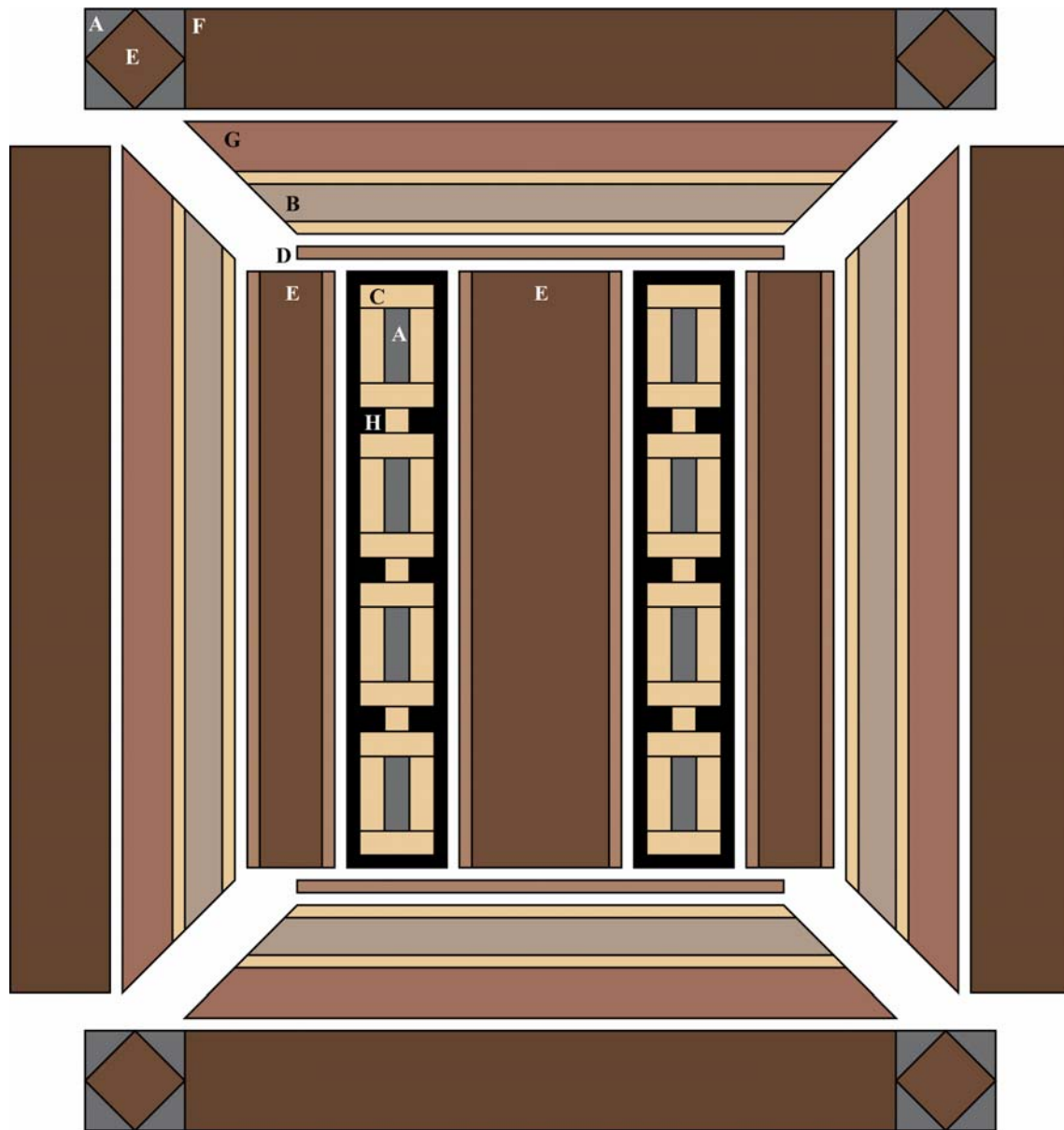
Sew a fabric D 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strip to each side of a fabric E 5-1/2" strip to make a narrow paisley unit. Make 2. Sew a fabric D 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strip to each side of the fabric E 11-1/2" strip to make a wide paisley unit. Make 1.



Instructions (cont'd)

Referring to the quilt assembly diagram, alternate the paisley unit rows with the block rows to complete the quilt center.
 Inside borders: Referring to the quilt assembly diagram sew the 70" strips together in the following order: fabric C – fabric B – fabric C – fabric G. Make 2 for side borders. Repeat with the 63" strips for the top/bottom border. Make 2.
 Center and sew the border units made in steps 6 to each side of the quilt top. Stop stitching 1/4" from the ends of the quilt center with an equal amount of fabric overlapping on each end. Miter the corners, trim away excess fabric and press seams open.

Border Blocks: Position a fabric A 4-1/2" square in opposite corners of a fabric E 8-1/2" square. Sew in a diagonal line, trim away excess fabric, fold out triangle and press. Repeat in two remaining corners to complete the block. Make 4.
 Sew a fabric F 8-1/2" x 68-1/2" border to opposite sides of the quilt top. Join a border block to each end of the two fabric F 61-1/2" border strips and sew them to the top/bottom of the quilt top.
 Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt the layers together. Bind to finish the edges.
